*1 Peter 4:10*

I imagine that if you are reading this edition of the *Trinity Chimes* then the Trinity Reformed Church is important to you. Maybe you are an active member of our congregation or perhaps you once were and now live away from this church but still want to keep up. Maybe you were baptized here, made profession of faith (confirmation), or even got married here. Or maybe, while you are not, nor have ever been, a member at Trinity, there is something else that connects you to us, as part of the extended wider Trinity church family and friends. For some reason Trinity Reformed Church is important to you and has meaning in your life.

I invite you to ask yourself why. Why is Trinity Reformed Church important?

Now imagine that you are not, in what ever way, a part of the Trinity church family. Trinity Church is no longer. How ever you answered the above question no longer exists. That is, the event, the role it plays in your life, that experience, whatever—it no longer exists. Which is not to say that the need for it doesn't exist. For example, let's say that Trinity is important to you because of the social role it plays in your life. Spiritually speaking, we'd call it fellowship, community. Every person is wired to various degrees as social beings. We are made, we evolved, to need one another, to be in community. But imagine if Trinity did not exist. How would that need have been met in your life? Would it have been met? Another example: Trinity, in whatever way, connects you to the divine. You experience God in worship, or in service at the soup kitchen, or in teaching Sunday School, or in small group bible study, or *Couples and Friends Club*, or... the list could go on. In some way you experience God at Trinity Reformed. Now imagine that that never happened (or happens). Would you be who you are?

I suppose this is the big question. If Trinity Reformed Church never existed, would it make a difference? And perhaps in a slightly different way, for those who are not yet connected to

Trinity in some way (or to any church for that matter,) does it make a difference? I'm focusing on our congregation Trinity not to be exclusivist, but rather, to be particularly personal. As one pastor asked of his congregation, "Of what use to this neighborhood, this community and these people can we be?" What difference does it make? Of the hundreds of people who pass our church building every day, does Trinity Reformed Church make any difference?

Our American culture is a culture of consumption. We are consumers. We bring this mindset to our religion. I have to confess that I don't care for this attitude and I don't just say this as a preacher who may not always give people what they want to hear. At my core, I don't believe we go to church—or are church—simply to get something. For instance, someone might say, "I didn't get anything out of worship." Well, the truth is, worship isn't about you. Worship is about God.

**And yet** church is about getting. It is about receiving God's grace. It's about sharing God's love. Church is a place and a people who give and receive from one another. We are stewards of God's grace, called to serve one another with what ever gift we have been given. For God has given everyone a gift. And God calls everyone to serve, to share. And this, ultimately, is what the church is to be about, who the church is to be. That the world might know God because they see how God's children serve one another. Even, how God's children serve the world, their neighbors.

Generally friends, I'm just raising various questions that I hope you think about. Church? Life? God? Meaning? But specifically, this is a stewardship message. This is not merely a message about giving more money to Trinity. (Although, you are most certainly welcome to do so!) This is a message about each and every one of us using the various gifts God gave us to share God's love, grace, peace, and hope—the good news of Jesus.

What kind of steward are you? How are you serving?
